

Saw HorseHBTC O&M manual

Thank you for purchasing this Saw Horse

For your safety, please ensure you read these instructions carefully before using, and keep these instructions in the work space where the sawhorse will be used at all times.

This manual details the safe operation of the Saw Horse.

Drawing

Please see the shop drawing (if requested), which describes the dimensions of the saw horse and identifies its Safe Working Load Rating(s).

Name Plate


Please refer to the name plate attached to the saw horse to confirm the Safe Working Load Rating(s) for this device.

What is the "Safe Working Load Rating"?

The Safe Working Load Rating is the maximum weight that can be loaded onto one (1) saw horse in either one of the two ways described below. It is extremely important that the load placed on any saw horse does not exceed the applicable Safe Working Load Rating. Overloading can lead to failure of the saw horse, potentially causing damage to the item(s) loaded on it and possible severe personal injury or death.

a) "Concentrated Load"

The maximum concentrated load at mid-span of the top rail of the saw horse, PER EACH SAW HORSE. This means that the maximum weight that can be applied to this saw horse is as stated on the Name Plate

under "Concentrated Load", when all the weight is concentrated at the middle of the top rail (fig. 1). The amount of weight that can be applied to 2 identical saw horses is double this value. For example, a steel I-beam weighing not more than two times the Safe Working Load Rating shown on the Name Plate can safely be carried by 2 of these saw horses.

b) "Uniformly-Distributed Load"

The maximum uniformly distributed load across the top rail of the saw horse, PER EACH SAW HORSE. This means that the maximum weight that can be applied to this saw horse, per lineal foot, is as stated on the Name Plate under "Uniformly-Distributed Load", when all the weight is distributed evenly on the top rail (fig. 2). The amount of weight that can be applied to 2 identical saw horses is double this value. For example, a pallet or skid weighing not more than two times the Safe Working Load Rating shown on the Name Plate can safely be carried by 2 of these saw horses.

Safe Operation and Use of Saw Horse

- 1. When lifting the saw horse, use proper lifting techniques to avoid personal injury.
- 2. Ensure work area is clean and well lighted while working.
- 3. Ensure saw horse is standing on a level surface that is clear and dry and free of debris.
- 4. It is important that all 4 legs have solid contact with the floor. If the saw horse is not positioned level and straight, loads placed upon it could fall, potentially causing damage to the item(s) loaded on it and possible severe personal injury or death.
- 5. It is extremely important that the load placed on any saw horse does not exceed the applicable Safe Working Load Rating. Overloading can lead to failure of the saw horse, potentially causing damage to the item(s) loaded on it, and possible severe personal injury or death.
- Never stack sawhorses to obtain extra height.

 suit your specific needs.

This HBTC saw horse is warranted to be free of defects in materials and workmanship for a period of 1 year from the date of purchase.


